

MATERNAL INFANT HEALTH PROGRAM (MIHP)

MIHP is Michigan's largest home visiting program for Medicaid-eligible pregnant women and newborn infants up to age 1. Ongoing services are provided up to 60 days after delivery and throughout your child's first year of life.



What is the Maternal Infant Health Program (MIHP)?

- Preventive health services by a home visiting agency certified by the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH).
- Support and coaching to promote healthy pregnancies & infants, positive birth outcomes, and to reduce infant deaths.
- Services provided by Registered Nurses, Dietitians, Licensed Social Workers, and Mental Health Specialists that specialize in infants.
- *Total Health Care and MIHP work together to help keep our mothers and infants healthy.*

What services do they provide?

- *Infant Health and Safety Education*
- *Assistance with Developmental Delays & Disabilities*
- *Baby Item Resources (based on donations)*
- *WIC / Food and Nutrition Planning*
- *Transportation Referrals*
- *Answer questions about being pregnant and caring for your infant*
- *Help with health problems that could affect your pregnancy, such as; diabetes, asthma, high blood pressure, depression, or anxiety*
- *Parenting Education and Support*
- *Mental Health Support*
- *Breastfeeding Assistance*
- *Housing and Holiday Assistance*
- *Smoking/Substance Abuse Information*
- *Support and Encouragement*
